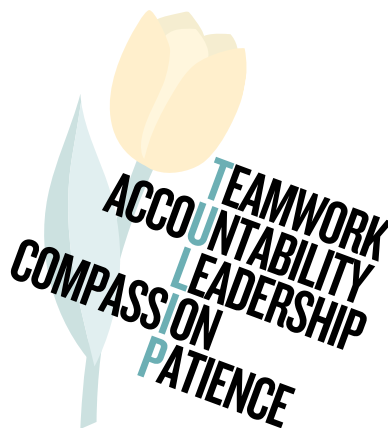
#### Jackie Szilagyi - Fourth Quarter 2025

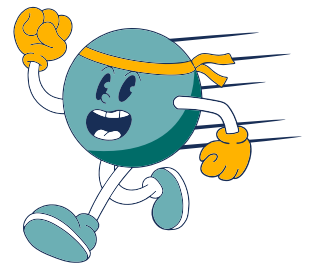

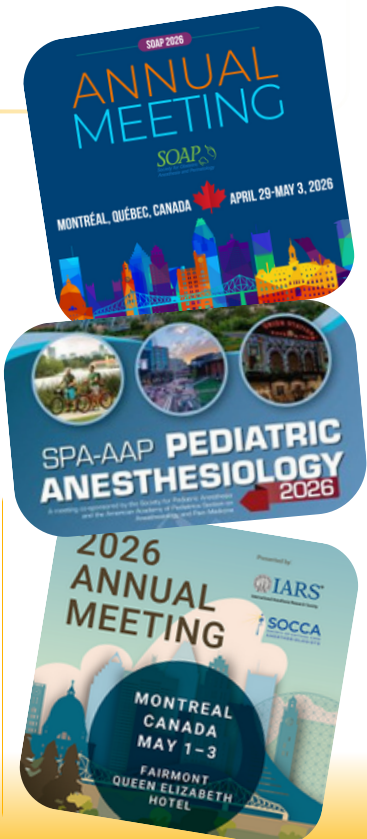
